Check-In and Measuring

Check-in required. All dogs must be measured prior to being checked in unless the dog jumps 26" (P22"), the handler presents a permanent card, temporary card with 3 signature awaiting a CMJ or check-in letter issued by USDAA / print out of dog info page from subscriber account indicating the dog is permanently carded. Please DO NOT mail cards or copies of cards.

Early check-in and set up for dogs that do not require measuring may be available on Friday evening. Check your confirmation for final details.

USDAA®, Agility Dog Champion®, Agility Dog®, Dog Agility Masters®, Advanced Agility Dog®, Master Agility Dog®, Grand Prix of Dog Agility® and Dog Agility Steeplechase® are registered trademarks. Jumpers MasterSM, Gambler MasterSM, Snooker MasterSM, Relay MasterSM, Performance Dog ISM, Performance Dog IISM, Performance Dog IIISM, Accomplished Performance DogSM, Performance National StandardSM and Performance Speed JumpingSM are exclusive service marks of United States Dog Agility Association, Inc.

Check-in and measuring could be as early as 7:00 a.m. Saturday and Sunday mornings. Check your confirmations for check-in and start times. Dogs and handlers who have checked in on Saturday do not need to check in on Sunday.

Walk-throughs and briefings could begin as early as 7:45 a.m. each day. Check your confirmation for the start times. Any dog and handler not present when their number is called will be ineligible to run, unless prior arrangements are made with the gate steward.

For Exhibition Only entries are not allowed. If a dog measures up, it must jump the higher height and will be placed first in that jump height. The dog may NOT be moved to performance at check-in or run at the lower height if it is measured up.

Class Descriptions

Two certification programs will be offered at this event – Championship & Performance. Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance Program classes for which they are eligible; however, under NO circumstance may a dog be entered in the same Championship and Performance class at this agility test (i.e. standard at any level in both programs). Classes include standard agility, gamblers, jumpers, pairs relay and snooker agility as set forth in Chapters 3 – 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations, each of which are conducted at three competitive levels.

Championship Program Classes

The Starters Standard classes shall be for dogs that have not earned the **Agility Dog®** title or Starters Standard title. Starters Non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have not earned a title in the class being entered (Starters Gamblers, Starters Jumpers, Starters Relay-3 different partners required-or Starters Snooker) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Advanced or Masters level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the **Agility Dog®** title.

The Advanced Standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the **Agility Dog®** title or that have earned a Starters Standard title. Advanced non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the **Agility Dog®** title or that have earned a title in the equivalent non-standard class at the Starters level, but have not earned the equivalent Advanced non-standard title or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Masters level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the **Advanced Agility Dog®** title.

The Masters Standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the **Advanced Agility Dog®** title or the Advanced Standard title. Masters non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the **Advanced Agility Dog®** title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced level or that had previously qualified for entry in the equivalent Masters non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

Performance Program Classes

Generally, Performance Level I, Level II, and Level III are run on courses used for Starters, Advanced and Masters classes in the Championship Program, with the following exceptions: the A-frame is set at 5'6", jump heights are one height class lower as set forth in Notes to Competitors, no spread hurdles are utilized and time standards in the standard and jumpers classes are extended by 3 seconds beyond that utilized in the Championship Program and the pairs relay class is non-qualifying. Eligibility for entry is determined as follows:

The Performance I Standard class shall be for any dog that has not earned the **Performance Dog ISM** title, the Performance Standard I title or a qualifying score in the Performance II or Performance III standard classes. Performance I non-standard classes shall be for any dog that has not earned a title in the class being entered (Performance I Gamblers, Performance I Jumpers, or Performance I Snooker) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Performance II or Performance III level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the **Performance Dog ISM** title.

The Performance II Standard classes shall be for any dog that has earned the **Performance Dog ISM** title, the **Agility Dog®**, the **Veteran Agility DogSM** title, but has not earned the **Performance Dog IISM** title or a qualifying score in the Performance III Standard class. Performance II non-standard classes shall be for dogs having earned the **Performance Dog ISM** title, the **Agility Dog®**, or a title in the equivalent Starters or Performance I non-standard class, but not having earned a title in the equivalent non-standard Performance II class or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard Performance III class. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the **Performance Dog IISM** title.

The Performance III Standard classes shall be for any dog that has earned the **Performance Dog IISM** title, the **Advanced Agility Dog®** title, the **Veteran Advanced Agility Dog®** title. Performance III non-standard classes shall be for dogs having earned the **Performance Dog IISM** title, the **Advanced Agility Dog®** title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced or Performance II level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Performance non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

Non-standard Class Descriptions.

Gamblers Class: This class consists of a course with no pre-determined route and each obstacle is assigned a point value. In the "opening period" the handler seeks to accumulate points by performing obstacles of his/her choice in the time allotted. At the conclusion of the "opening," the handler attempts the "gamble," a sequence designed by the judge to be handled from a distance, for additional points. This non-standard class is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 and 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

Jumpers Class: This class consists of a course of jumps and may include a tire and tunnels. This non-standard class is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 and 7 of USDAA.

Snooker Class: This class has an "opening" sequence of point collection similar to the Gamblers followed by a closing sequence of a set pattern. It roughly parallels the billiards game of "snooker," requiring the dog to successfully complete a "red" jump prior to attempting an obstacle designated as any other color. This non-standard class is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 and 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

Pairs Relay: This class consists of a standard course with one dog and handler running a portion of the course, followed by a baton exchange to a second handler and dog who run the second portion of the course. Partners must be in the same level and in the same height division, mini (Ch 12/16, Perf 8/12) or open (Ch 22/26, Perf 16/22). In the event only one dog is entered in a program/level, un-entered dogs or dogs from another program/level may NOT be recruited to form a qualifying pair. As of 1/1/09 relay will be required for Performance Versatility titles. This non-standard class is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 and 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

CPAC will award rosettes for 1st through 4th in each test class at each jump height. Prizes will be awarded for 1st place in each class at each jump height. Pairs awards will be awarded by mini and open divisions.

All dogs earning a qualifying score in a titling class will receive a maroon qualifying rosette or ribbon.

Grand Prix of Dog Agility® World Championships & Performance National StandardSM - Local Qualifiers

These tournaments are open to all competitors regardless of titles earned or skill level. Both are a single-round tournament featuring the sport in its basic form. The course includes obstacles as set forth in Chapter 3 of USDAA Rules and Regulations for standard agility, except that no table obstacle shall be used. Standard scoring shall be applied. Competitors must have a ZERO fault round to earn a qualifying score for which qualifying ribbons are presented. One qualifying score

is required for entry in Round 1 of a Regional Championships. Two qualifying scores required for entry into the quarterfinals at the World Championships.

Awards: Rosettes will be awarded to 1st thru 4th place in each jump height.

Dog Agility Steeplechase® Local Qualifier & Performance Speed JumpingSM Qualifier

These tournaments are open to all dogs regardless of titles earned or level of competition. A dog may not be entered in both Steeplechase and Speed Jumping at this event. Steeplechase: One qualifying score as described in the complete rules is required for entry in a Regional Championships, and two are required for entry in the quarterfinals in the World Championships. Speed Jumping: Two qualifying scores as described in the complete rules is required for entry in the semifinals at the World Championships.

Awards for Steeplechase/Performance Speed Jumping:

Local Qualifiers: Prize money shall be computed based upon 20% to 40% (at club's discretion) of the total entry fees to be allocated in accordance with the payout table below regardless of the size of entry in any height class.

Directions:

From the North: 101 Fwy south to 126 East to Old Telegraph Road (look for brown Kenny Grove Park signs). Turn Left on Old Telegraph Rd. Proceed to 7th Street. Turn left on 7th Street. Right on Oak. Turn left into Kenny Grove Park.

From the South: 5 Fwy north to 126 Hwy west. Travel thru Fillmore to Old Telegraph Road. Turn Right. (look for brown Kenny Grove Park signs). Proceed to 7th Street, and turn Left. Turn right on Oak. Turn left into Kenny Grove Park.

Note: The 126 Hwy is also called Ventura Street as it passes thru Fillmore

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

Competitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA Rules and Regulations, as amended March 30, 2007, including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry, and will comply. USDAA's official Rules and Regulations are hereby incorporated by reference a copy of which may be viewed online at www.usdaa.com.

Following are the jump heights for the Championship Program (Performance Program heights in parentheses):

- This test is open to all dogs being at least eighteen months of age, including purebred and non-purebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness that may affect the dog's ability to perform safely, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression.
- ♦ All dogs must be registered with USDAA in order to compete in USDAA sanctioned events. You may register online at www.usdaa.com, General Information, to receive a registration number immediately and a measurement card prior to the show. Registration may also be made concurrently with entry to this show, a form for which is included in this Agility Test Schedule.
- ♦ No leads, collars, food, toys or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time. No training, pinch, or shock collars will be permitted on or around the course at any time.
- ♦ Safety shall be of foremost consideration at all times. Handlers, through entry at this event, accept full responsibility for themselves, their guests and the actions of their dogs. Any competitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Show Committee, be asked to leave the show. In such case, no refund of any entry fees will be made.
- ♦ The Organizing Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the committee views that participation by competitor or dog would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee so doing must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA office) in anticipation of or upon receipt of entry. The

notice must include the reason for refusing the entry and a brief explanation of the basis for their decision. The burden of responsibility for appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Organizing Committee.

- ◆ No entries shall be accepted, changed, altered or withdrawn after the closing date.
- ◆ THERE SHALL BE NO REFUNDS for entries withdrawn after the closing date or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of reason for such dismissal.
- ◆ Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. There will be a \$20.00 service charge for returned checks. Payment of entry fees and service charges shall be made in cash or money order within 30 days of postmark notice of returned check where notification is received after event date. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration number(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awards must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event or entry is canceled without recourse by owner/handler. No refunds for overpayment of fees will be made for less than \$15.00.
- ◆ Dogs must remain on leash at all times, except when competing in the ring or in the warm-up jump area.
- ◆ No dogs may be left unattended except when properly kenneled in designated kennel areas. Day kenneling only is permitted. USDAA and Dog Agility Racing Team cannot and do not assume any liability for loss of any items left unattended.
- ◆ No entry fees will be refunded if the Test cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, Act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strike or any other cause beyond the control of the organizers.
- ◆ Agility obstacles shall meet the requirements of USDAA Rules and Regulations.
- ◆ Dogs must be exercised only in designated areas. **Please pick up after your dog.**
- ◆ **Fault limits may be applied** in all classes for which faults are assessed. Limits shall be announced during the judges' briefings.
- ◆ Mismatched or incomplete pairs shall be accepted as draw entries only.
- ◆ There will be no equipment familiarization at this event.
- ◆ All Competitors, through entry at this event, waive any and all rights relative to video broadcast of this event. Competitors shall have the right to videotape portions of this event for their personal use only. No portion of this event may be videotaped for commercial or other purposes. All video, broadcast and telecast rights for this event are the exclusive property of United States Dog Agility Association, Inc.
- ◆ Portions of this event may be taped for television. Through entry at this event, ALL COMPETITORS and HANDLERS HEREBY GRANT to USDAA and its representatives, agents, and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog's name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media now known or hereafter to become known. All exhibitors and handlers hereby release USDAA and its representatives, agents, and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right.
